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## Introduction

Student leaders are encouraged to be courageous leaders who are authentic, service oriented, inclusive and hope-filled. Leadership is exercised in all areas of our school life. It is important, therefore, that we offer opportunities for all young people to develop their leadership skills. In line with the Catholic Social Teaching we intend to promote and provide the following:

### Introduction

- Leadership opportunities that are embedded in the learning and teaching environment so that all young people progress in their understanding of themselves as leaders in the school, and wider community.
- Young people leading across all contexts of school life – in faith formation, learning and teaching, pastoral wellbeing and extracurricular activities.
- Young people recognising that they are valued contributors to decision making within our school and encouraged to participate in school improvement, school review and future planning.
- Inclusive, collaborative and distributed leadership models forming the basis for student leadership within our Catholic school.
- Leadership roles that are defined carefully to ensure that they are developed in a way that will serve the school community and provide opportunities for service and representation across a wide group of young people and years.
- Targeted training is provided for those young people who take on specific roles or responsibilities.


### Pastoral and Liturgical (PAL) Ambassador

# Wider Achievement

### Children's University



Pupils are given opportunities to take part in exciting, interactive and voluntary learning activities, outside of normal school hours. Pupils collect credits and gain certificates while they learn. Children's University hold graduations, at universities, with caps and gowns. Taking part lets children explore different learning environments, and become independent and confident learners. It raises aspirations, boosts achievement and instils a love of learning that will stay with children throughout their lives.

### Lessons from Auschwitz Ambassadors



Lessons from Auschwitz Online will offer students the unique opportunity to learn about the history of the Holocaust through a bespoke online learning environment, accessing artefacts, text, film, and virtual explorations of Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial and Museum. Students will consider the individuals whose lives were affected by the Holocaust and the relevance of the Holocaust today by:

- Taking part in three live sessions, led by experts in the history of the Holocaust and Holocaust education
- Hearing directly from Holocaust survivors, who will share their personal experiences, including during a live survivor testimony and Q&A
- Participating in a virtual exploration of Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial and Museum
- Considering the relevance of this history in today's world
- Sharing what they have learnt within their school and wider community.

### Mark Scott Leadership for Life Award



The Mark Scott Leadership for Life Award brings together over 150 S6 pupils from 60 schools across the Central Belt of Scotland. The participants are drawn from different social, economic, religious and cultural backgrounds, to work together to deliver projects to benefit their local communities.

Through the Award participants in their final year at school gain social confidence, communication and organisation skills, develop their resilience, and maintain their own mental wellbeing, as well as raise aspiration.

### Personal Development



Higher Personal Development is only available to pupils in S6, offering opportunities to develop skills in team working and leadership. The course is designed to support S6 young people in identifying their areas of strength and target setting to improve on areas for development, and offers opportunities throughout the course to further these goals. Pupils plan, organise, run and evaluate the success of whole school events such as the MacMillan Coffee Morning for staff, the Christmas lunch for pensioners from local care homes and delivering mini lessons on wellbeing to S1 and S2 young people.
