Prelim Exams

- 2 week diet of exams.
- Mon 9th Fri 20th January 2023.
- For most candidates, exams will take place in the Games Hall.
- For some, exams will take place in ICT or Eng 10/Eng 11.
- Timetables will be issued (paper copy and on Teams) if there are any clashes or problems, please see Mrs Maughan straight away.











Prelim Exams

- It's possible you will have more than one exam on any given day - this is unavoidable.
- A clash is only when 2 subjects are timetabled at the same time on the same day.
- Possible strike action on $10^{th}/11^{th}$ Jan no prelims on those days.












What to expect

This is what the exam hall looks like:





What to expect

You must attend each exam wearing full school uniform.

The exam hall can be cold, so make sure you have your blazer and school jumper.



Mobile phones



- SQA have a very strict policy about mobile phones.
- NO mobile phones are allowed in the exam hall not even in your pocket or in your bag.
- You won't be able to bring your phone (or any other device) into the exam hall.











- For all of your exams, you will be allocated a seat number it is important you sit in the correct seat.
- When you sit in your exam, you must check the exam paper that is in front of you.
- Check the subject and the level are correct and what you are meant to be sitting.
- You are allowed a clear pencil case on your desk.
- Bring some spare pens and pencils in case one runs out.
- · Bring a ruler and a rubber too in case you need it.











<u>Timings</u>

- It is really important that you arrive early on the days you have an exam.
- You will be asked to line up in the Crush Hall before quietly and calmly entering the exam hall.
- Exams have strict timings, so it's important that they start on time.
- You can check how long you have left using the large clocks on the wall.











 Once you are told to start the exam, regular exam conditions apply, so you are not allowed to talk or look around at other candidates.



 SQA impose severe sanctions for any candidate who is believed to have been cheating. This can affect all of your subjects.











Additional Assessment Arrangements

• Some candidates require extra arrangements for exams, such as extra time, use of ICT, sitting the exam in a separate room etc.

• If you have a specific need such as dyslexia, Autism, Aspergers and think this could apply to you, please speak to Miss Glass (Support for Learning) as soon as possible.











What do I do if I am absent?

- You should make every effort to be at each of your exams.
- If you are sick on the day of an exam, or there is a family emergency do not panic!!
- Contact the school phone the school office / email your teacher / Pupil Support teacher / Head of Year.
- We will try to make arrangements for you to sit the Prelim when you come back to school.











How to prepare

- Get organised!
- Have a folder for each subject and organise all your notes within each folder (unit by unit).
- Make a study timetable plan your time.
- Build in short breaks to your study plan.
- Come to supported study sessions.
- Try past paper questions.











Ways to study

- Revision mind maps
- Flashcards
- Past Paper questions
- Voice record notes/facts and listen back
- Make summaries of your notes highlight key points
- Add diagrams to explain facts











Remember...

- Prelims are like a practice run for the SQA Exams use your prelim results to motivate you to get even better results in April/May!
- Once you've got your results back, ask your teachers for feedback on what you can do to improve and build on any weaker areas.
- Prelim results are used in the case of an appeal they are really important
